THE GREAT SACANDAGA RESERVOIR

Located in the southern foothills of the Adirondack Mountains, the 29-mile-long Great Sacandaga Lake is the largest man-made body of water in New York State. The film tells the early history of the Sacandaga Valley and explains how the waters of the Sacandaga and Hudson Rivers flooded with runoff every spring damaging homes and businesses all the way to Albany. The film reveals how the people of the Sacandaga Valley had to sacrifice their homes, farms and livelihood to make way for the series of dams, bridges and roads, which were completed in March 1930 at a cost of \$12 million.


